Sheffield Ageing Well Programme and links to Enhanced Care in Care Homes (EHCH)

In Sheffield we have created a dedicated team who are focussed on delivering the nationally funded Ageing Well Programme within our locality. The team comprises representation from Health, Social, Voluntary, and Private Organisations who are working in partnership with the people of Sheffield to provide services that deliver 'what matters' to our community in line with the NHS England Ageing Well recommendations.

The programme has some core principles:



One of the three Core workstreams to the programme includes Enhanced Care in Care Homes (EHCH) with a key objective of *Enhanced Support and better co-ordinated care and reablement and rehabilitation.*

As you can see from the diagram below our GP's and other primary care providers of services, are one element to the EHCH Programme.
