

Apply for a Speak Up grant

What are the Speak Up grants?

Speak Up is a micro grants programme, offering funding between £500 and £1000 for projects which reach out to people across Sheffield to hear about health and social care.

The grants are available to not-for-profit, voluntary, and community groups.



What does it involve?

You'll plan a small project which helps people in your community to Speak Up about their care – this might be interviews, a focus group, surveys, or something else.

You'll share what people told you, and we'll write a report based on your findings, making recommendations for change.

Why should you take part?

Perhaps you know that the people you work with face barriers to accessing care? Maybe the health and care system isn't communicating properly, or people aren't getting the treatment they should expect?

By helping us to hear from people across the city, you can make change. Together we'll make recommendations, helping services to provide the care that people in Sheffield need, based on real experiences.
