### What is Healthwatch Sheffield?

Healthwatch Sheffield is your independent local watchdog for health and social care. We help children, young people and adults have a greater say on how services such as doctors, dentists, hospitals and care homes are designed and run.

We are one of 152 local Healthwatch organisations throughout England which were set up by the Health and Social Care Act 2012.

We also provide information and advice about accessing and using these services through our partnership with Sheffield Citizens Advice.

## Making a difference

Healthwatch report into Adult Social Care

In February 2014 we published a report into Adult Social Care services and the impact of changes Sheffield City Council were planning to make.

We found that some people, especially those isolated by geography, language or physical ability, told us they did not feel listened to, and felt less likely to contribute to discussions about their care.

People told us about their experiences and what they would like to change.

Your feedback led to Healthwatch Sheffield making a set of 6 recommendations which we put forward to Sheffield City Council.



#### Raising concerns about services

We saw a report from the Care Quality Commission (CQC) about a Sheffield specialised care service that concerned us.

We asked out mailing list if they had any experience of using this service and two people came forward to tell us their stories, including some alleged abuse by the service in the past.

We immediately spoke to the organisation which had commissioned the service and we also raised our concerns with Healthwatch England and the CQC, who investigated further.

As a result, the provider has sent a detailed response to the concerns raised by the complainants, and invited Healthwatch Sheffield to visit them to see what they do.
