# Looking back on 2013

Healthwatch Sheffield came into being in April 2013, and a lot has been achieved over the past eight months.

The team has worked hard to establish working relationships with key organisations, and consortium providers - Sheffield Cubed - have been reaching people in their local communities to find out what they think about services and adult social care.

#### Some highlights include;

- 162 meetings with local organisations
- 9 community events, including stalls at Sheffield Pinknic, Hillsborough Leisure Centre and Crystal Peaks Shopping Centre
- 3 discussion forums held
- 5,500 flyers distributed
- 1,345 hits on the Healthwatch Sheffield website
- 1,198 newsletters distributed
- 612 members sign up

We are looking forward to a busy year ahead in 2014, with the appointment of our full Governing Body due to take place in April 2014. Once in place, the Governing Body will steer our work for the next two years. Other key projects include;

#### **Adult Social Care Review**

Healthwatch Sheffield is currently carrying out a piece of work on the Sheffield City Council's Adult Social Care Review.

We have received 69 responses to our 'Have your Say' survey. Two discussion sessions were held on 6th December, in partnership with Disability Sheffield, which 45 people attended. Participants were asked a series of questions relating to social care, with some very indepth discussions taking place. The most important thing to those present was *personcentred care*.

We are working in partnership with High Green Development Trust and Broomhall and Broomhill Churches Together project, who are supporting us to find out people's views in their local communities.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey, and congratulations to Ian Wallace who was the lucky respondent to receive £30 worth of High Street vouchers. We would also like to thank members of our Virtual Advisory Network (VAN) who publicised our work through their networks and membership.

We will be analysing the findings from our members and will be producing a report, and presenting our findings to senior members of Sheffield City Council at a public meeting, to be organised in the New Year.



## Making health and social care information accessible

NHS England has begun a programme of work to develop and implement an Information Standard for accessible information.

This guidance will inform organisations on how they should ensure that disabled patients/ service users and (where appropriate) carers, receive information in languages and formats that they can understand, and that they receive appropriate support to help them communicate, which may include advocacy.
