Taking the pulse of Sheffield's services

For the last six months we've been out and about asking people to share their experience of using health and care services in Sheffield.

We've received nearly **800 responses** so far, which enables us to have a look at which areas are rated as good by the people of Sheffield, and which could do with some improvement.

Our last data (January to March 2014) tells us that in terms of getting an appointment that suited you, dentists scored best, with only 7.5% of people responding 'no' to this question. This compares with 15% of people having difficulty accessing opticians and 20% at their GP practice.

We're still collecting information through the surveys and will be compiling a comprehensive report later in the year.

You told us about doctors... I'd like the front of house staff to be courteous. Patients are largely people who are ill or worried, and all they need is a smile and reassurance most of the time.

> You told us about dentists... It's hard to find an NHS dentist who's taking on new patients.

You told us about opticians... Now my health centre has an optician in the building, it makes it very convenient for me.

> You told us about hospitals... Expensive parking and lack of spaces can make hospital appointments & visits very hard.

You told us about care services... When I'm introduced to new support workers, they tend

to talk across me, which makes me feel like a small child or lesser than them.

Spotlight on: Adult Social Care - The Care Act

The Care Act 2014 is one of the most important pieces of legislation that will affect everyone, as it sets out in law a number of reforms to care and support services. It's currently still out for consultation but is due to be implemented in April 2015.

There are 3 key themes:-

- 1. Personalisation is achieved when a person has real choice and control over the care and support they need to achieve their goals to live a fulfilling life and to be connected with society.
- 2. We should do everything we can (...) to prevent, postpone and minimise people's need for formal care and support.
- **3.** People will be **empowered to make decisions about their own care** and support through **radical improvements to information** on the options available to them.

There will be big changes for carers, people who fund their own support, young people in transition, the ways you can access information and advice, and how people are helped to stay independent. In some cases the legal requirements are already being met, but in others, Sheffield City Council may need to improve or modify current practice, and in certain cases, make significant changes.

Disability Sheffield have said:

"We will be watching with interest how the local authority implements the elements of the Care Act which promote greater choice and control for disabled people."

Update on Volunteering

Over the past couple of months we've been busy recruiting and training our team of Healthwatch volunteers.

Healthwatch Ambassadors

We held 3 briefing sessions in June for people who wanted to become Healthwatch Ambassadors.

More than 15 people attended and we have recruited 9 Ambassadors who will be spreading the word about Healthwatch Sheffield in their local communities.

Enter and View

One of Healthwatch's statutory powers is to carry out 'Enter and View' visits at health and social care premises, either announced or unannounced.

These Enter and View visits are to observe the nature and quality of services, to see and hear how the consumer experiences the service, and to collect the views of patients, residents, their relatives and carers.

Findings from Enter and View visits are collated as evidence-based feedback and reported to the service provider, Care Quality Commission (CQC), the local authority, NHS commissioners and quality assurers, Healthwatch England and any other relevant organisations.

Our Enter and View trainees have completed mock Enter and View assessments as the final part of their training. The volunteers visited wards in the Northern General and Hallamshire as well as a private care home provider, focusing on orthopaedic trauma, neurological conditions and intermediate care.

The three teams made a number of recommendations which have been finalised and included in the final reports.

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Update on Volunteering (continued)

Seven people have successfully completed thir training and will be official Enter and View Authorised Representatives. Once the DBS clearance forms are returned the Authorised Representatives will begin Entering and Viewing services across the city.

Our next round of Enter and View training will begin in the autumn. All volunteers must undertake 3 days training to be considered for the role:-

Session Two - Safeguarding, Equal Opportunities and DoLS Wednesday 22nd October 2014: 10am to 5pm <u>or</u> Wednesday 29th October: 10am to 5pm

On the 17th June we held a discussion forum on Health Inequalities, which was in response to members wanting to attend the Health and Wellbeing Board previous event which due to high demand had sold out of tickets within 2 hours.

We wanted to offer these people the chance to have their say, so we held an additional Health Inequalities session with the same key speaker. Forty people came along on the day and were involved in lively discussion and debate.

We have continued with our 'Your Health, Your Say...' questionnaire and have had more than 800 responses. We'll be publishing our baseline report shortly, so watch this space!
