Celebration Event

On Tuesday 26th June we welcomed volunteers, partners and supporters to a special event to launch our Annual Report and our two year strategy, 'Together for Good'. We were pleased to welcome representatives from health and social care - both statutory and voluntary sector, commissioners, local councilors, service users and their families.

The event was hosted by our Chair, Judy Robinson and our key note speaker was the Deputy Director of Healthwatch England, Neil Tester. Neil said "What shines through... is the representation of different communities in Sheffield. Such an effective focus is really heart-warming."

We were pleased to be joined by Sharon Hirshman, a local Deaf resident, who led the workshops that contributed to our 'Not Equal' report and Lee Harker, a valued member of the Test Bed Advisory Group who spoke about the group's engagement work.

Our two year strategy was informed by many hours of engagement with local people. Staff and volunteers heard from 543 people about a wide range of concerns. At our celebration event, Healthwatch Sheffield volunteer, Abi Hunter presented the findings of our engagement and the areas that we will focus on over the next two years.

Our strategy sets out the difference we want to make by 2020, and how we will achieve our three aims:

- 1. Support local people to have their say.
- 2. Bring voice and influence to existing health and care commissioners and providers as well as emerging local partnerships.
- 3. Build capability and capacity across local health and care services to effectively involve local people.









#SpeakUp Small Grants

Maternity Mental Health

The first phase of this research is now underway, focusing on people's experiences of maternity and mental health.

Improving Breast Cancer Treatment

A new Yorkshire Cancer Research funded study is inviting women with breast cancer to contribute to focus groups regarding the development of a psychological treatment. The researchers are keen to increase adherence to medication and improve patients' well-being.
